What's a Modern Quilt?

Great question to which there are many different answers. The Modern Quilt Guild™, a world-wide association of modern quilters and guilds, of which the Niagara Modern Quilt Guild is a member has this to say about defining what is a modern quilt:

Today, at the heart of modern quilting is innovation. The emphasis is on design and originality over replication and perfection of technique.

The full spectrum of modern quilting styles and techniques, include:


Improvisation, Asymmetry, Alternate Grid, Graphic or Bold Colours, Use of Negative Space, Modern Traditionalism, Minimalist and Maximalist Design

Improvisation

The majority of the piecing in the quilt top is done improvisationally, without the use of a defined pattern or templates.

Alternate Grid

Block layouts do not follow the predictable nature of standard grids moving the viewer's eye around the auilt.




Graphic or Bold Colours

Modern quilters often use bold, bright colours and prints, high contrast and graphic areas of solid colour.



Use of Negative Space

Quilt design incorporates the use of large expanses of area in a single colour around other pieced or appliquéd elements creating contrast and is often heavily quilted.



Minimalist Design

The design of the quilt emphasizes extreme and form to achieve

Modern Traditionalism

The quilt design incorporates the use of an identifiable traditional block pattern and reimagines it by applying elements of modern design such as asymmetry, colour, scale.



Maximalist Design

In a maximalist quilt, the entire space may be simplification of content densely filled with colour and layers. Quilters might maximum visual impact. use all prints, all solids, or a combination of the two.




