

# Facing your fear of improv together

When we start quilting, we usually learn about patterns, precise cutting, piecing, and accurate seams. This round robin won't include those rules. Come with excitement and openness to create freely! Your improv quilt will be created simultaneously by you and your fellow guild members. You need to watch Cheryl Arkison's webinar for instructions on creating improv blocks and quilts. Log in to access the recording: https:// www.themodernquiltguild.com/resource/take-the-leap-facing-your-fears-of-improv/.

Consider making some trial blocks shown by Cheryl's descriptions to create your starter block. Your round robin quilt will be made from your own fabrics and a surprise insertion from each of the day's participants. You will have scheduled times to work as you help each quilt grow. Your quilt will move from one quilter to another and your basket of fabrics will travel with it, Karen and Lorna are managing the day but you are your own teacher - learning as you go and the result will be a surprise!

**Date:** March 22, 2025

Location: Trillium United Church, 415 Linwell Road, St. Catharines, Ontario

**Time:** Set up at 9:00 am finishing at 3:00 pm

**Lunch:** Bring your own. Coffee and tea will be provided.

The day will start with instructions starting at 9:30 am so our machines will need to be set up and ready to sew. \*Everyone ready to sew at 9:30 am will have an entry ballot for a draw prize.. \* and at end of day an entry for a participation prize.\*

**You will need:** • Regular quilting supplies along with your sewing machine (remember your cord and pedal), extension cord a cutting mat, rotary cutter, ruler. A seam roller (not essential but will save you time) **NO IRON** •

A basket or container to hold all your fabrics and your quilt to move from quilter to quilter.

**Fabric** • a combination of large scraps (2 -3 metres); WOF 1/4 metre to 1/2 metre.(2-3) Bring fabric that you like and that people can play with, not your most prized yardage. • 1 metre for a signature/feature fabric which you will add to everyone's quilt as the quilts move from one quilter to the next. This fabric will stay beside your sewing machine for you to insert as you add to the quilts being created.

Think of this as adding your signature to each of the guilts you are helping to build.

**Preparation** • A starter block using your fabrics approximately 12" x 12" Your choice of design. ( not the signature fabric) • Watch Cheryl Arkison webinar


# QUILTING KINDNESS




# NMQG Block of the Month with a Twist Block March 2025 # 6

March is a blustery month. Every changing weather here is a chance to pay with colour, value and design. Look through the blocks that are in the box. Is there a colour missing? Do you need a little contrast? Whether you are working on your own quilt or someone elses or both lay the block out to get a sense of the flow of the blocks.

This month we're exploring foreground and background with the Mod Economy Block designed by Rebecca Severt of the Baltimore MQG.

Learn to make the block, plus get a bonus design lesson and quilt pattern in this month's Block of the Month!




From the dark gray fabric, cut: [1] 4-1/2" square [8] 2-1/2" squares	From the white fabric, cut: [2] 3-3/4" squares. Cut each square once along a diagonal. [4] 2-1/2" squares
From the yellow fabric, cut: [2] 4-7/8" squares. Cut each square once along a diagonal.	From the green fabric, cut: [4] 1-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangles [4] 1-1/2" x 5-1/2" rectangles
From the light gray fabric, cut:  [4] 1-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangles  [4] 1-1/2" x 5-1/2" rectangles  [4] 1-1/2" x 2-1/2" rectangles	


August 2017 MQG BOM (Remember the colours in the block your making will be different than the ones stated below.)

Block Assembly Instructions:

### Step 1:

Sew a 3-3/4" white triangle to opposite sides of the 4-1/2" dark gray square. Press seam allowances toward the triangles. Repeat on remaining sides of the dark gray square. Trim the square in a square (SIAS) block to 6-1/8" square.





# Step 2:

Sew a 4-7/8" yellow triangle to opposite sides of the SIAS unit from Step 1. Press seam allowances toward the triangles. Repeat on remaining sides of the unit. Trim the SIAS block to 8-1/2" square.

# Step 3:

Sew a 1-1/2"  $\times$  4-1/2" light gray rectangle to the top of a 1-1/2"  $\times$  4-1/2" green rectangle, along a 4-1/2" edge. Press toward the green.

Repeat to make four units like this.



### Step 4:

Place a 2-1/2" dark gray square at one end of the unit, aligning the top, bottom and one side of the square. Ensure that the marked line is positioned as shown here. Sew on the marked line. Trim the seam allowance to 1/4" and press toward the triangle. Repeat with one remaining unit from Step 3.




Place a 2-1/2" dark gray square at the opposite end of a Step 3 unit, positioning the marked line as shown. Sew on the marked line, as in Step 4. Trim and press.

Repeat with the remaining unit from Step 3.



Sew one Step 4 and one Step 5 unit together, as shown. Press the seam open. Repeat to make a second unit. Sew to opposite edges of the block center.






Sew a 1-1/2" x 5-1/2" light gray rectangle to the top of a 1-1/2" x 5-1/2" green rectangle, along a 5-1/2" edge. Press toward the green. Repeat to make four units like this.

# Step 8:

Sew a 1-1/2" x 2-1/2" light gray rectangle to the left edge of a Step 7 unit, as shown below. Repeat to make a second unit.




### Step 9:

Sew a 1-1/2" x 2-1/2" light gray rectangle to the right edge of a Step 7 unit, as shown above. Repeat to make a second unit.


# Step 10:



Place a 2-1/2" dark gray square at one end of a Step 8 unit, aligning the top, bottom and one side of the square. Ensure that the marked line is positioned as shown here. Sew on the marked line. Trim the seam allowance to 1/4" and press toward the triangle. Repeat with one remaining unit from Step 8.

# **Step 11:**

Place a 2-1/2" dark gray square at one end of a Step 9 unit, positioning the marked line as shown. Sew on the marked line, as in Step 10. Trim and press. Repeat with the remaining unit from Step 9.

# **Step 12:**

Sew one Step 10 and one Step 11 unit together, as shown. Press the seam open. Repeat to make a second unit. Sew to remaining edges of the block center.

### **Step 13:**

Place a 2-1/2" white square at one corner of the block. Ensure that the marked line is positioned as shown here. Sew on the marked line. Trim the seam allowance to 1/4" and press toward the triangle. Repeat for all corners.

The block should measure 12-1/2" square.
