She's passionate about protecting earth's creatures along with their habitats, and hopes her work will inspire us to share her sense of urgency around this message.

This is the month the President's challenge is launching!!!!

Goal: Inspire you to try a new technique, design something original and modern!

Topic: Alternate Grid

Assignment:

Create a quilted piece using the Alternate Grid technique.

The challenge does not have any size / colour restrictions. Use your imagination to create something unique and new to you!

What is Alternate Grid:

Modern quilts often use alternate gridwork. Alternate gridwork means arranging your quilt in unconventional or unexpected ways.

Alternative Gridwork serves to break up the predictable nature of a standard grid. It creates visual tension as the left side of the brain seeks to recognize a pattern and a rhythm to the block layout. It's a useful tool to move the viewer's eye around the layout of the quilt as they seek out that pattern.

All quilts have an underlying structure; typically blocks are set in a row and column grid that in many traditional quilts is easily identifiable. The alternate grid gives quilters the flexibility to manipulate the grid and with even small shifts make big changes in a quilt design.

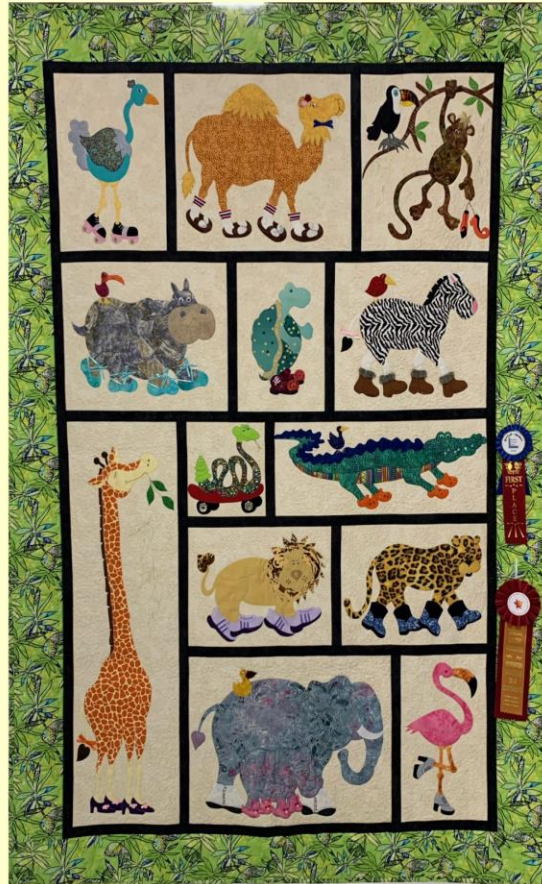

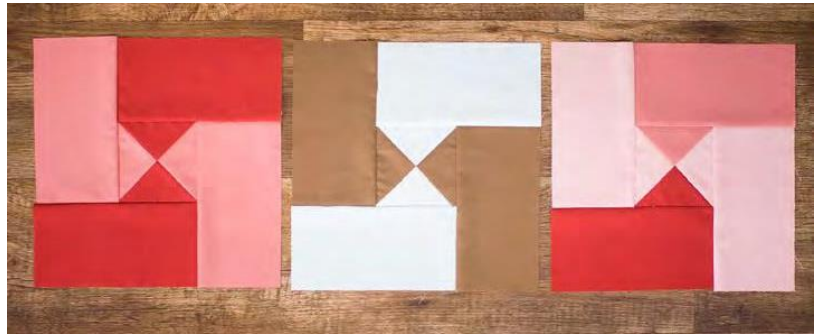

NMQG BOM for April 2025 is called Whorl Block 7.

It is April already! Just a note and a reminder. A Label was included in all your boxes so they can be signed by the member who did a turn with your block. I have been notified by some that this has not been done. Don't be shy! Please sign the label and return your block this month. It is not feasible for the organizers (aka Jo V) to look through the boxes and add names.



I will have two-micron pens at each meeting at the table to sign the labels. At the July meeting if your label has not been signed, I will have the list so you can add them. If a box is missing a label, I have a few spare labels available.

The feedback has been very positive 3 more blocks to go! Jo V

It comes from the resource section of the MQG from 2021. It is a fun block which give movement to the design. You can make it in two or three colours. Choose something that will complement the other blocks in the box and give it a whirl! (Pun intended)

Included is the complete pattern so you can see the fun ideas

ABOUT THE BLOCK

Put your quarter-square triangle skills from this quarter's Modern Fundamental to use with this spinning block. With a partial seam in the mix, this is a great block to practice techniques without a lot of stress.

MATERIALS

Materials used in samples include:

Moda Bella Solids in:

Tomato Soup 9900-42, Bunny Hill Pink 9900-195, Coral Rose 990-319, Ruby Ice 9900-169 and Cocoa 9900-180

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS:

Seam Allowance is scant 1/4" unless otherwise stated. Width of fabric (WOF)

Fabric A (Tomato Soup): Fat eight assumed to be 42" of usable fabric design. Press seams in the directions listed.

Fabric B (Bunny Hill Pink): Fat eight

For detailed tips on sewing quarter-square triangles, see MQG Fundamentals: Quarter-Square Triangles.

RST = right sides together HST = half-square triangle

QST = Quarter-square triangle

CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS

From Fabric A, cut:

- (1) 8½" x 20" strip. sub cut:
- (2) 8½" x 4½" rectangles
- (1) 5½" x 5½" square

From Fabric B, cut:

- 8½" x 20" strip. Sub cut:
- 8½" x 4½" rectangles
- 5½" x 5½" square

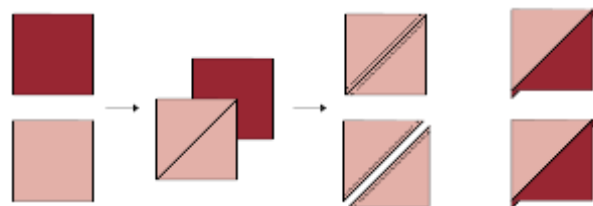
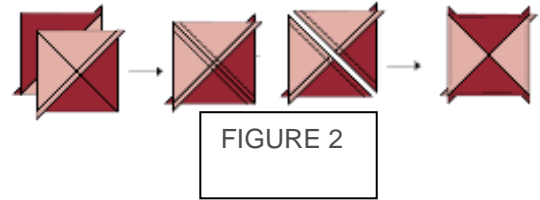

PIECING INSTRUCTIONS

1. Place the 5½" x 5½" Fabric A and Fabric B squares RST. Using a fabric-safe marking tool of your choice, draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of the lighter square (Figure 1).



2. Sew a scant ¼" on each side of the drawn line.
3. Cut along the drawn line to make 2 HSTs.
4. Press to the side.

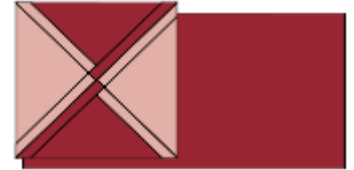
5. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of one HST block (Figure 2).

6. Place two HST blocks together, nesting center seams, matching alternate colors together.

7. Sew a scant ¼" on each side of the drawn line.

8. Cut along the drawn line to make 2 QST blocks.

10. Press seams open and trim to 4½" x 4½" square.



2 With right sides together, sew the Fabric A side of one QST block to a 4½" x 8½" Fabric A rectangle, stopping halfway, as indicated by black line in **Figure 3**. Press partial seam toward Fabric A rectangle.

Sew one Fabric B rectangle to the QST/Fabric A rectangle (**Figure 4**). Press seam away from the QST block. Repeat

11. Sew one Fabric B rectangle to the QST/Fabric A rectangle (Figure 4). Press seam away from the QST block. Repeat with the second Fabric A rectangle (Figure 5).

12. Fold the first Fabric A rectangle back and sew the second Fabric B rectangle to the QST/Fabric A rectangle (Figure 6). Press seam away from the QST block.

13. Sew the remaining seam of the first Fabric A rectangle to the QST/Fabric B rectangle (Figure 7). Press seam away from the QST block.

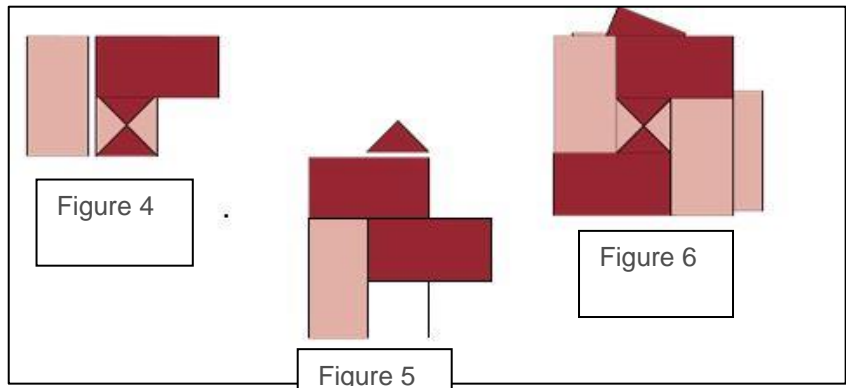

QUILT LAYOUT IDEAS

Make 20 blocks for a 48" x 60" quilt top, rotating every other block 90° for a spinning whorl effect.

Fabrics A and B – 1½ yards each, cut:

- (4) 8½" x WOF strips. Subcut:
 - (36) 8½" x 4½" rectangles
- (2) 5½" x WOF strips. Subcut:
 - (10) 5½" x 5½" squares
- (1) 4½" x WOF strip. Subcut:
 - (4) 4½" x 8½" rectangles

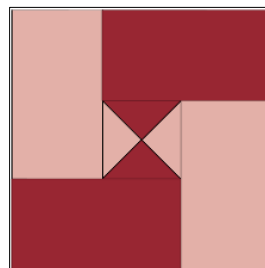
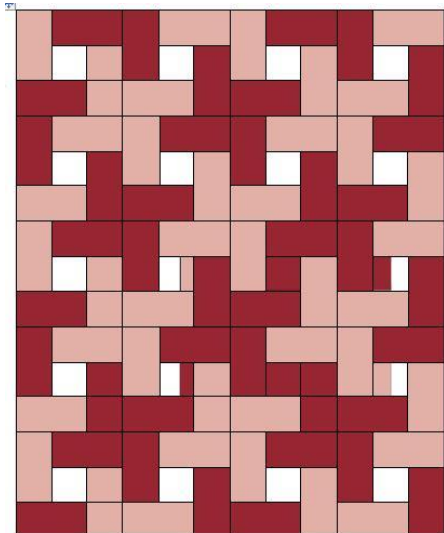

THREE-COLOR OPTION

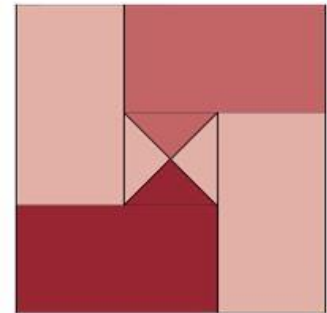
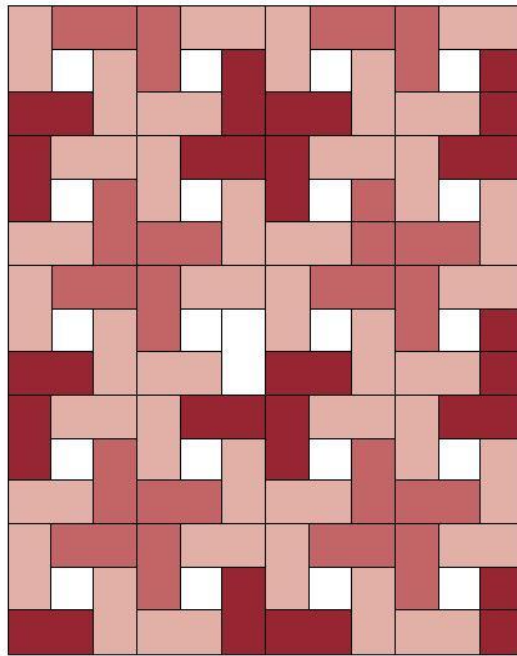
Switch half of the Fabric B pieces with a Fabric C for a little extra interest, or use a contrasting color.
Make 20 blocks for a 48" x 60" quilt top.

Fabric A – 1½ yards, cut:

- (4) 8½" x WOF strips. Subcut:
 - (36) 8½" x 4½" rectangles
- (2) 5½" x WOF strips. Subcut:
 - (10) 5½" x 5½" squares
- (1) 4½" x WOF strip. Subcut:
 - (4) 4½" x 8½" rectangles

Fabrics B and C – 1 yard each, cut:

- (3) 8½" x WOF strips. Subcut:
 - (20) 8½" x 4½" rectangles
- (1) 5½" x WOF strip. Subcut:
 - (5) 5½" x 5½" squares

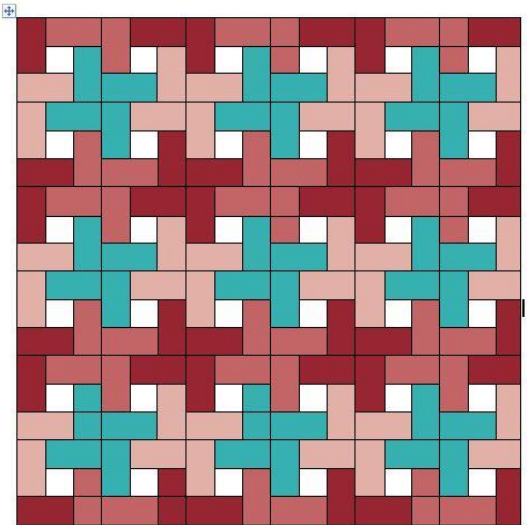
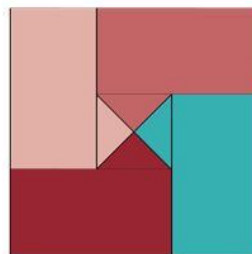


FOUR-COLOR OPTION

Using four different colors will result in QST blocks with two different orientations. Make 36 blocks, pairing Fabric A with Fabric B, and Fabric C with Fabric D to create the HSTs in Step 1 and piece together as shown below for a 60" x 60" quilt.

1½ yards each fabric, cut:

- (4) 8½" x WOF strips. Subcut:
 - (36) 8½" x 4½" rectangles
- (3) 5½" x WOF strips. Subcut:
 - (18) 5½" x 5½" squares



THREE-PATCH QST OPTION

Try a three-patch version of the block by using a background $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x $5\frac{1}{2}$ " square in Step 5 instead of a 2nd HST block. This will result in two orientations, just like the four-color version. Make 10 blocks and add two large background panels for this 48" x 60" quilt.

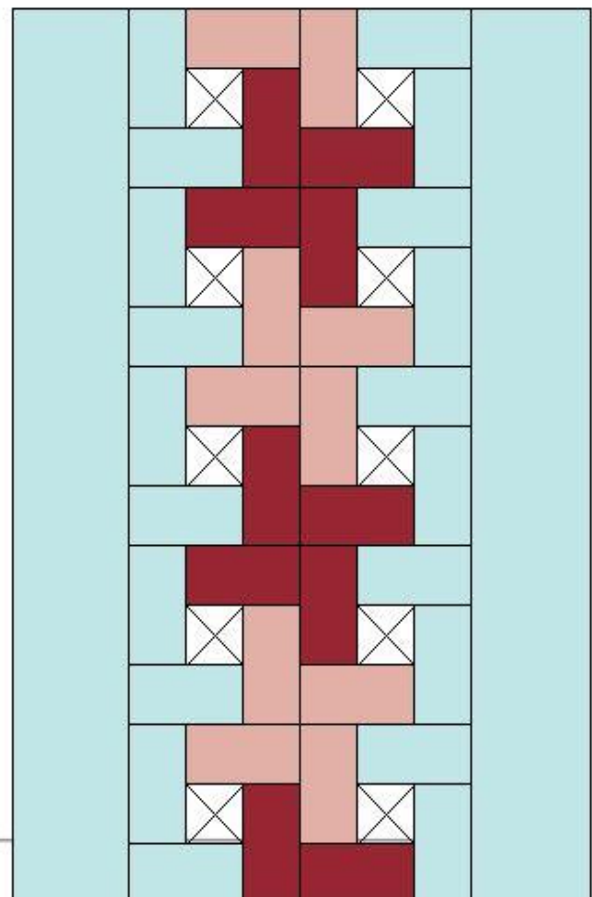
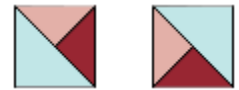
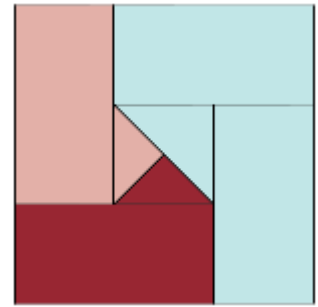
Fabric A (background) – $1\frac{5}{8}$ yards, cut

- (1) $16\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip.
 - (3) $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Leave one strip for background panel. From remaining strips, subcut:
 - (1) $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x 8" rectangle
 - (20) $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles
 - (1) 11" x WOF strip. Subcut:
 - (1) 8" x $16\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle
- Cut remainder into (2) $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x 25" strips and subcut:
(5) $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x $5\frac{1}{2}$ " squares

To make the background side panels, sew the $16\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip to the $16\frac{1}{2}$ " x 8" rectangle and trim to $16\frac{1}{2}$ " x $48\frac{1}{2}$ ". Repeat with the $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip and $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x 8" rectangle. Trim to $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x $48\frac{1}{2}$ ".

Fabrics B and C – $\frac{3}{4}$ yard each, cut:

- (2) $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Subcut:
